Thanks! Together we raised \$209,489!

With federal food stamp usage up by 79% in Connecticut over the past five years, many families struggled to find the money to buy turkey and all the fixings for Thanksgiving this year. But thanks to the 2014 Liberty Bank/Rotary Club Thanksgiving Dinner Drive, families living in Liberty Bank's service area benefitted from \$209,489 raised to supply that food—a record for the 11-year-old partnership between the bank and 33 local Rotary Clubs.

Rotary Clubs in 35 towns teamed up with 49 Liberty Bank offices to raise \$167,620 during the weeks after Columbus Day. At the end of the drive, the Liberty Bank Foundation added 25 cents for each dollar raised, totaling \$41,869. Rotarians used the funds to purchase and deliver Thanksgiving food to needy families, or donated the money to a local nonprofit organization that provides Thanksgiving baskets. All donations were used to provide food in the communities where they were given.

"Each year, our drive gets larger, with more branches, more Rotary Clubs, and more dollars raised," said Sue Murphy, executive director of the Liberty Bank Foundation and a member of the Middletown Rotary Club. "At the end of the day, though, it's really all about neighbors helping neighbors—communities coming together to take care of their own."
