ROTARY FOUR-WAY TEST SPEECH CONTEST



The Rotary Four-Way Test implores us to ask of the things we think, say, or do:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

RULES & GUIDELINES FOR SPEECH CONTESTANTS

Subject:

- The speech challenge is to use the Rotary Four Way Test to evaluate the ethics of a topic of choice.
- Topics may include individual life experiences, current or historical events, societal or global issues, life situation or problem. Topics may be serious or humorous, unique or commonplace.
- Speeches do not need to emphasize all four-way test elements equally, but must address each element.

Content

- Speech content must be original, prepared by the contestant, and not a variation of another product.
- Speeches may include quotations, statistics, and/or references to research or ideas from identified sources.
- No slides, videos, or projected images are allowed. Demonstration props or visual aids may be used, but should not be a central part of the speech (and are not required).

Requirements & Judging

- The speech may not be read, but notes are permitted on 3x5 index cards..Speeches may be practiced and delivered from memory.
- The speech must be at least 5 minutes and not longer than 7 minutes in length, or points will be deducted from score.
- Speech contestants (for all contests) will be identified by number and not by name or school.
- A panel of judges will evaluate speeches based upon their application of the 4-way test, interest of topic and the ethical arguments presented, and effectiveness of delivery. See the judging rubric for guidance.

General Eligibility & Structure:

- Participants can be any grade, freshman to senior, and do not need to be in Interact or Debate Club.
- The winner of our contest will continue to compete at one of two semi-final contests and possibly at the final contest, which will determine the winner for Rotary District 7980 (the four counties of southern Connecticut).
- Winners give the same speech at semi & final contests, but can work to improve their original speech.

Contest Schedule:

- Our contest is for students from Lyme/Old Lyme, Old Saybrook, and Westbrook High Schools and will be held at:
 - Day/Date: Monday/March 3rd Time: 6 pm Location: Conference Room at Acton Library
- The winner from our contest will then compete at the semi-final contest on:
 - Day/Date: Saturday/March 22 Time:10 am Location: Slater Hall, Norwich, CT
- The District final contest will be at Old Saybrook High School

Day/Date: Saturday/ April 26

Time:9 am - Noon Location: Old Saybrook High School Auditorium

Participation Certificates and Awards:

- The top two candidates from each of the two semi-final contests will continue to the final contest.
- The winner of the final contest will receive \$500. The other three contestants will each receive \$250.
- All participants will be given a certificate of participation (to verify this as a resume booster for college applications).
